Booking Terms and Conditions

- Bookings for Visiting Parties are available Weekdays between 9.30am and 12 noon and 1pm to 3pm excluding Wednesdays.
Selected Weekend Days are available, please contact the office for details. Please note each package is £7.50 more per person on weekend dates.
To make a booking telephone 01325 355324 ext 1 or 2 to check availability of the dates required and to make a provisional booking.
Complete the booking form and return to the Darlington Golf Club with your non-refundable deposit of £50.
Please Note: We will only hold a provisional booking for two weeks after which if your deposit has not been received we will be unable to hold the date.
If you book for more than 12 players and less than 12 play the more expensive rate applies.
On receipt of your completed booking form and deposit, The Darlington Golf Club will issue a booking confirmation letter.
- You should discuss your catering requirements direct with our Caterer, telephone 01325 355324 ext 3. Vegetarian meals should be notified at least 7 days in advance.
Final numbers for both golf and food must be advised 48 hours before your visit.
We reserve the right to charge the full amount due for food once the 48 hours window has passed.
- Any alterations to the booking must be made 48 hours prior to playing.
- Buggies:** The Professional has a limited number of two-seater buggies for hire. Contact the Professional's Shop on 01325 355324 ext 2 for details.
- Nearest the Pin and Longest Drive can be arranged for you providing you notify the Club at least 7 days in advance.
- Upon arrival all golfers must report to the Golf Shop.
- The Visiting Party Organiser will be responsible for the payment of the guaranteed numbers. All accounts must be paid at the Golf Shop prior to play. Payment by Debit /Credit Card, Cheques made payable to "The Darlington Golf Club" and Cash are accepted. (Payment by Credit Card has a charge of 2.5%)**
- Starting times will be allocated to visiting parties when the booking is confirmed. Please adhere to these times as an alternative tee time cannot be guaranteed for anyone missing the allocated starting time.
- Individual medal play is permitted only with prior agreement. Play will be from the yellow tees, and your co-operation with the Starter/Golf Pro will be required.
- The Darlington Golf Club reserve the right on the day to re-organise the format/timing in the event of unfortunate circumstances (bad weather or late arrivals).
- The Darlington Golf Club (Members) Ltd cannot accept liability for any claims, actions or demands arising from damage or loss to goods and/or property left unattended in the Darlington Golf Club and it's buildings, overnight or otherwise. Any items of goods and/or property left are the sole responsibility of the owner and are left entirely at the owners own risk.

Please ensure that your Party are aware of the following conditions which are strictly enforced.

- Handicaps:** All members of your party must be conversant with the etiquette of the game and should possess a CONGU handicap. **Under no circumstances are absolute beginners allowed to use the Course.**
 - Pace of Play:** It is important for other course users that visiting parties play at a reasonable pace - this will be monitored by the Course Warden on duty.
Note: During the autumn/winter period, ground conditions may prevent or restrict the use of buggies and/or trolleys.
 - Mobile telephones must not be used on the courses/practice ground, except in an emergency. In the Clubhouse they must be confined to the foyer by the main entrance.
 - Dress :** At the Darlington Golf Club the overall standard we expect would be clothing that is acceptable as traditional golfing apparel. It is the responsibility of members and visitors to present themselves with attire and footwear, which is smart, clean and tidy and appropriate to the circumstances.
Our aim is to provide a relaxing atmosphere for both members and visitors but inevitably there will be occasions where the code will be abused and therefore we highlight below that which is, or is not, broadly acceptable on the Course and in the Clubhouse.
- Shirts**
- Must be collared, mock turtle style or rollneck. All shirts to have sleeves.
 - Ladies can wear sleeveless shirts but they must have a collar.
 - All shirts to be tucked into the waistband unless they are an approved 'Fitted' Shirt specifically designed to be worn outside the trousers.
 - No Replica Sports Shirts other than those specifically designed for Golf to be worn.
- Trousers and Shorts**
- No Blue Jeans, faded Denim Jeans of any colour, Shell Suits or Track Suits to be worn. (Smart Jeans are permitted in the Clubhouse after 5.30pm)
 - All shorts worn must be tailored.
 - Calf length trousers may be worn provided they are NOT 'Combat' Style.
 - Tailored Shorts may be worn in the Dining Room during Summer.
- Footwear**
- Recognised Golf Shoes only to be worn on the Course.
 - No Training Shoes of any type to be worn. (Discretion can be used with regard to young children)
- Hats and Caps**
- All Hats and Caps on the Course must be worn as intended and not reversed.
 - All Hats and Caps cannot be worn in the Clubhouse.

Safety

- The Organiser will be made aware of the Fire Evacuation Procedure and must pass this information on to the members of the visiting group.
- The Organiser needs to be vigilant and make the members of their group aware of any potential trips or falls whilst on the premises, advising that appropriate footwear should be worn at all times.
- The Organiser must ensure the group adheres to the etiquette of golf, especially with regards to dangerous play and wayward shots.
- The Organiser needs to make the members of their group aware of the public footpath running across the 11th and 16th fairways.
- The Organiser needs to make the members of their group aware that no alcoholic drinks are allowed on the course.
- The Organiser needs to make the members of their group aware that care and due diligence must be adhered to when using motorized buggies on the course. Please pay particular attention to other course users who are not using buggies and give consideration to the inevitable difference in the pace of play.
